Medicare Assistance Program

State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) (800) 307-4444

Provides free information, counseling, and assistance to Medicare beneficiaries in Nevada

Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) (888) 838-7035

Empowers and assists Medicare beneficiaries, their families and caregivers to prevent, detect, and report healthcare fraud, errors, and abuse through counseling, outreach, and education

Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act (MIPPA) (800) 307-4444

Helps Medicare beneficiaries who are low income receive Extra Help with their Medicare costs

Senior/Disability Rx (866) 303-6323, Option #2

Provides a monthly subsidy toward your Medicare Part D or Advantage Plan Part D premium. As a member of the SRx/DRx program you can also enroll in, or change, your Part D or Advantage Plan with our Special Enrollment Period.

Eligibility:

- Must be enrolled in a participating Medicare Part D Plan (PDP) or a Medicare Advantage Plan including Part D (MAPD)
- Must be at least 18 years of age.
- Includes income from all sources for both applicant and spouse. Effective July 1, 2019, the maximum annual household income for **singles is \$29,869** and for **couples is \$39,816**.
- lived continuously in Nevada for at least 12 consecutive months

Provides temporary Part D prescription drug coverage for low income Medicare beneficiaries not already in a Medicare drug plan.

Collects and compares prices for every FDA-approved prescription drug at more than 70,000 US pharmacies, provides free coupons to use at the pharmacy, and shows the lowest price at each pharmacy near you.

Provides prescription drug discount cards.

Patient Advocate Foundation Co-Pay Relief 1-866-512-3861

A free service that provides direct financial support to medically and financially qualified, insured patients for co-payments, co-insurance and deductibles related to pharmaceutical treatments and prescription medications.

Eligibility:

- Must be currently insured and have coverage for medication seeking financial assistance
- Have a confirmed diagnosis and treatment plan
- Must reside and receive treatment in the United States
- Income must fall at or below 300% or 400% of the Federal Poverty Guideline (FPG) with consideration for the Cost of Living Index (COLI) and number in the household

Finds the low-income prescription drug program that you are qualified for and adjusts your plan as your health status changes, helps you to continue receiving prescription help from the Patient Assistance Programs you are accepted into, and offers assistance in obtaining a Pharmacy Discount Card.

Helps patients facing high medical out-of-pocket costs by providing financial assistance of their copayments, coinsurance, deductibles, and other health-related expenses.

Pathway Plus Patient Assistance Program

If you do not have access to alternative sources of coverage or funding of Abbott Nutrition products, you may qualify for Abbott Nutrition's Patient Assistance Program. This program is designed to provide supplemental product at no cost to eligible patients experiencing financial difficulties.

Eligibility:

- Reside in one of the 50 states or the District of Columbia and have no healthcare insurance coverage for the requested product
- Have no access to alternative sources of coverage or funding
- Meet financial eligibility criteria
- Require 100% of their caloric needs from the requested product

A non-profit advocacy organization that provides resources for lifesaving and life-extending treatments to people in need of access to care.

Eligibility:

- Must have a valid Social Security number
- Patient income must be at or below 500% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
- Required to have insurance coverage which covers at least 50% of the cost of treatment

- Must be diagnosed with covered disease and program must be accepting enrollments
- Must be seeking assistance for a prescribed medication that is FDA approved to treat covered diagnosis

National Organization for Rare Diseases “Rare Care” 1-800-999-6673

Assistance programs to help patients obtain lifesaving or life-sustaining medication they could not otherwise afford. These programs provide medication, financial assistance with insurance premiums and co-pays, diagnostic testing assistance, and travel assistance for clinical trials or consultation with disease specialists.

Eligibility

- Patient has an applicable diagnosis or physician referral
- Patient currently lives in the United States
- Patient meets NORD’s financial criteria
